PART 3

Project for Seniors Moves Ahead Edwardsville Intelligencer - June 13, 1973

An Edwardsville Seniors Citizen's Club could have two meeting places in town, thanks to two local churches.

One is the Catholic Newman Center at 306 W. Park St., which already been secured for a senior club, thanks mostly to May Clya Hartung.

The other is the old Rohrkaste Dairy building at 1003 N. Main now owned by Eden United Church of Christ.

The Eden church council has voted to recommend to the congre that the building be leased to a senor club here, according to the Wesley W. Bornemann, pastor.

The proposition must still be approved by the congregation at la

The council gave its approval, provided the senior group can co up with financing to refurbish the old dairy by September, the Rev. Bornemann said.

The Catholic Church will lease the Newman Center to the senior group for \$1 a year, Hartung said. The arrangement was conclude recently after several weeks of negotiations between Hartung and Catholic Diocese of Springfield.

Hartung said the center would need some refurbishing, but that t cost would probably not be great. Some refurbishing, to provide minimum utility service has already been done, the Mayor said.

The Rohrkaste Dairy-assuming the Eden congregation approves i lease- will require about \$17,000 to remodel as a senior citizens according to organizers of the group here.

Revenue Sharing

Several of the backers met Tuesday afternoon with Edwardsville Township officials to see if township revenue-sharing money can be made available for the renovation.

Township Supervisor Hays Mallory said, in effect, that he has h doubts about whether the township could legally spend money for a project.

However, Mallory said he would seek a legal ruling on the mat

While federal revenue-sharing guidelines allow local governmer spend money on "social services to the poor and aged," Mallory s he didn't think state statutes would allow townships to spend their fu on senior citizen programs. State law supersedes federal guidelines the spending of revenue-sharing money, Mallory said.

Also representing the township yesterday were Township Auditor Norman Warren and Roy D. Wolfe.

Wolfe said he was in favor of an organized senior citizen effort he but that there was still the question of the legal expenditure of the revenue sharing funds.
