#### Senior Citizens Organize Edwardsville Intelligencer - June 23, 1973

About 225 Edwardsville area senior citizens filled the meet room at Montclaire Bowl Thursday afternoon to organize the club for seniors here.

The group elected A.F. Meyer president, and approved four other officers: Louis Perini, first vice president; Lucille McCle second vice president; Helen Rinkel, secretary; and William Homann, treasurer,

The seniors generally agreed that persons 55 years old and would be eligible to take part in club functions, but that a str minimum age would not be enforced. For the time being, apparently, the club is primarily for seniors in Edwardsville Township.

The group heard Mayor Clyde Hartung say that refurbishing the old Catholic Newman Center on Crane Street is moving ahead. The center, informally known as the St. Mary's Cotto will be leased by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield the senior group as a meeting place. The building, a one-sto frame house, will be called the Senior Citizens Cottage.

Kay Kendall, a member of a support committee established help get a senior club going, described plans for remodeling old Rohrkaste Dairy building at 1003 N Main St. Eden Unit Church of Christ, which owns the building, is considering ma it available to the senior club. The church council has so recommended, but the matter must still be approved by the e congregation.

Remodeling plans, copies of which were passed out at yesterday's meeting, were drawn up by Mrs. Kendall's son, Stephen Kendall, a graduate student in planning and urban design at Washington University, St. Louis.

The senior group is still trying to get the estimated \$17,000 needed for remodeling the Rohrkaste building. The Eden cou recommended the building be made available to the seniors provided they can get the remodeling money by September.

The group has been attempting to secure Edwardsville Town revenue-sharing funds for the project, but whether this can be done remained in doubt yesterday.

Township Supervisor Hays Mallory spoke briefly to the grou vesterday, but was non-committal about the use of revenue-sh money for remodeling.

Mallory said he sought an opinion on the matter from R. Da Yung, legal counsel for the Illinois Department of Local Government Affairs in Springfield.
